Nº 4 Newnham Terrace

As noted in the 'Stop-Press' in the recent *Darwinian*, The College has the unexpected chance to buy Nº 4 Newnham Terrace. This is the final house in the Terrace not owned by The College and the last piece of the jigsaw to consolidate our footprint from the Silver Street Bridge around the whole reach of the river to the Mill Pond and Granta Public House.



Newnham Terrace would allow the College to extend the main site and gardens round the entire Mill Pond reach of the river (Nº 4 is just to the left of the tree).

The Diocese of Ely currently owns Nº 4, but 'out-of-the-blue' contacted the College to ask our interest in buying the house – we were very keen, but displayed admirable control during the discussions! Nº 4 would immediately provide more student accommodation right on the main site; it would also allow the rear gardens of Nº 4 to Nº 12 to be joined to the already beautiful main gardens, and hold out the potential to develop the Terrace further at some future point.

In order to take such a major project forward successfully, the College needs to raise funds. We plan to do this by approaching grant-making organisations, College alumni/ae, and other friends. At the outset, we are delighted to be able to announce that one of our *Emeritus* Fellows, **Richard King**, already a very generous benefactor, has given another **£100,000** as start-up funding towards this purchase. Alumni will receive a letter later in the year setting out the project and its details more fully.
